QDAC Code of Conduct

Welcome to the Queenstown Dog Agility Club (QDAC). The club was established to provide an opportunity for dogs and handlers to come together and participate in the fun sport of dog agility in a safe and supportive environment. As a club we appreciate active participation from all members, especially at times of fundraising or decision making.

These are some basic rules (based on Dogs NZ rules) established by the QDAC primarily for the purpose of dog and handler safety. Please read these rules carefully. Your signature on this form indicates you understand these rules, agree to abide by them and to actively promote them when participating in club sessions.

1. All dogs participating in agility training must be a minimum of 5 months old. Dogs must be a minimum of 16 months old before training on slightly elevated contact equipment or higher jumps other than those at micro height.
2. Dogs are not permitted to attempt jumps higher than class height.
3. All dogs must be considered in reasonable health/fitness. Dogs that are carrying excess weight will be advised to refrain from any jumps/contact equipment until the instructor/s are satisfied they are in sufficiently healthy condition.
4. All dogs participating in training and agility sessions are to wear collars that are flat. No chain style collars are permitted. No choke chains allowed.
5. All members at the training/session are to help either take out and/or put away the agility equipment.
6. When not under direct class instruction, or single running of a course, dogs must be kept on a leash, crated or restrained in a cool vehicle at all times. The dogs may have leash free runs at the end of class/sessions for socialisation if directed by instructor/committee.
7. It is recommended that handlers wear closed toe footwear with a reasonable amount of grip.
8. Handlers need to be aware that some dogs may need a large personal space. All handlers must respect this need and not allow their dog to become too close to other dogs.
9. The direction of instructor should be followed during all training particularly with regard to dog/handler safety. The handler agrees to keep their dog off all equipment they have not been trained on by club instructor.
10. All prospective members have to successfully complete our 4 week foundation agility course. After successful completion a decision should be made as to the preferred type of membership and must continue with beginner training (until instructor sees fit). The appropriate membership fee must be paid promptly.
10.1 Exceptions are made for handlers and dogs that are transferring from other dog training clubs. These will be assessed on a case by case basis.
11. Handlers must toilet their dog prior to each class/session and as required during the class. Please always have bags to clear up after your dog and water down/clean any accidents especially on equipment immediately. This is the responsibility of handler. All dog mess and personal rubbish to be taken home by handler to dispose of.
12. Participating in any club training, sessions or competition days is wholly at the risk of the handler and no responsibility will be taken for injury to a dog or handler by Queenstown Dog Agility Club or any of its members.
13. Any member who is concerned with the conduct of any other member/dog should discuss the matter with the instructor. If they are not satisfied with the outcome, the concern should be addressed in writing for discussion at the next scheduled club meeting.
14. Members are not allowed to be a member of any other dog agility club within 100km of Queenstown, with the exception of membership purely for Dogs NZ affiliation.
15. Bitches in season are not to attend training sessions and competitions as per Dogs NZ rules.
16. Breaches of these rules can result in expulsion from the club with no refund of monies paid for membership/training.
